
Right Care Right Place

Get the right care where and when you need it.



Green Zone: See your primary care physician or nurse practitioner (PCP)

Schedule an appointment for:

- Checkups, immunizations, health screenings
- Chronic conditions such as diabetes, high blood pressure, asthma, emphysema, heart disease
- Fever, sore throat, cough, ear pain, colds and flu
- Urinary tract infections
- Injuries such as sprains, cuts

- Rash Other infections
- Mild headache Vomiting,
 - diarrhea, abdominal pain

Yellow Zone: Get immediate care

You're unable to reach your PCP and you need care for an illness or injury that cannot wait. (See Reverse)



Red Zone: Go to Emergency Department or call 911

Emergency room copay applies.

You have severe life-threatening symptoms such as:

- Chest pain or pressure
- Choking
- Extreme pain
- Serious injury to the head, neck or back
- Suspected poisoning or overdose from medicine or alcohol*
- Stroke symptoms such as loss of balance, face drooping, one-sided weakness, speech or vision difficulty, severe headache Severe stomach pain
- Severe burn

- Suicidal thoughts or ideas**
- Trouble breathing
- Uncontrolled bleeding
- Uncontrolled shaking or seizure
- Loss of consciousness (passed out)
- If your child is younger than one month and has a temperature of 100.4°F or higher.
- If your child is not acting right not making eve contact, feels limp or has a strange cry.
- If your child is having difficulties breathing or starts to turn blue.
- If your child has uncontrolled shaking and you suspect a seizure.
- If your child shows signs of dehydration not making tears, has a dry mouth and dry diapers.
